

General Requirements

1. All exhibits must be removed from the fair grounds within 24 hours after exhibits are officially released by the Fair Association.
2. The Iron County Fair Association will not assume any liability for exhibits left on the premises after they have been released by the Fair Association.
3. Vegetables and crop exhibits must be claimed immediately after the exhibits are released. Otherwise, they will be disposed of by the Iron County Fair Association.
4. Exhibits are officially released at 6 p.m. on Sunday. No exhibits may be released before that time. Exhibitors must show exhibitor receipt to department supervisor in order to release exhibit.
5. Open Class Exhibits are open to residents of the Chequamegon area of Wisconsin. This includes residents of Iron, Ashland, and Bayfield counties. Open class Livestock departments are also open to residents of Gogebic County and Ontonagon County, Michigan.
6. Officials may conduct such tests and examinations as may be necessary to determine the disease status of any animal and to exclude or remove any animal affiliated with or suspected of being afflicted with any contagious disease.
7. Health records should be delivered to the fair manager before animals are unloaded at fairgrounds. All animals exhibited should be identified by registration name and number or by ear tag number. Health records and fair entry blanks should be kept on file in office and made available to state and federal inspectors.
8. Registration certificates must accompany all purebred cattle.
9. Only animals entered in specific classes or events are permitted on the fair grounds during the fair.
10. All stable or stall space is reserved for use by Fair exhibitors and participants and the space and use of same must be authorized by the Fair Board or its Agents.
11. All horses and cattle stabled and or exhibited at the Fair must be haltered and securely tied at all times while in the stall.
12. Proof of negative Coggins Test will be required for all draft and saddle horses entering the fair grounds as per state health regulations. A copy of said test results shall be furnished the Fair Board.

Special Notes

1. Due to Insurance policy changes, youth under the age of 8 or in 2nd grade or younger as of January 1 of current year, are no longer permitted to exhibit livestock or animals at the Iron County Fair.
2. Exhibitors must be in control of their animals at all times. If the Fair Board makes the determination that an animal exhibits unruly or unsafe behavior, the exhibitor will be asked to remove the animal from the premises due to safety concerns.
